Ask friends and family what they think

Obviously you don't want to rely too heavily on other people's opinions, as this is *your* tattoo and not theirs. But still, getting feedback from a trusted source is a great way to decide if your tattoo idea is fitting or not. Even going into the tattoo shop itself is an excellent way to get feedback. Usually the artists there will be honest and straightforward about what they think of your design.
